



Pima Community College Scholarship Application 2019-2020

Rotary Club of Tucson

Eligibility: Applicants must enroll in 6 or more units per semester if also working full time, 9 or more units if working part time, and 12 or more units if not employed, must have financial need as determined by PCCC's Financial Aid Office, must participate in four (4) Rotary Club of Tucson activities during the school year, have demonstrated passion for community service, and a) **first-year Pima students** must have a high school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better or a minimum average GED test score of 165, or b) **second-year Pima students** must have a minimum of 3.5 GPA at Pima and be enrolled in the Honors Program.

Applications must be completed by 30 May 2019. Applications received after 30 May will not be accepted.

Introduction: This scholarship stems from the generosity of the women and men of the Rotary Club of Tucson, one of more than 33,000 Rotary Clubs in the world, following a 65+ year history of providing financial support for the college education of Tucson's young people. This scholarship offer is for **\$400/semester** and the program allows annual reapplication for a second year at Pima College and to the University of Arizona for up to 3 years (4 years total) subject to Rotary's discretion, the student maintaining a 3.0 GPA, the student's financial need, the student meeting Rotary's citizenship requirements, and the student meeting our Rotary participation requirements.

Obligation to Participate: I understand that this scholarship offer is made as a tuition-only supplement (\$400 per semester) for my next year at the Pima Community College. If selected, I agree and commit to participating in the following: I will attend a minimum of **two (2)** Rotary Club of Tucson meetings (12pm – 1:20pm Wednesdays), **two (2)** Rotary Club of Tucson community service events, and **two (2)** University of Arizona Rotaract Club meetings during this school year. [Note: Rotaract is a student club whose purpose is fellowship and community service. Membership in Rotaract is not required to attend the Rotaract meetings.]

Financial Need: It is the Rotary Club of Tucson's intent to award scholarships to students with financial need. Therefore, each applicant must complete and submit to Pima College a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. These forms will be evaluated by the school's Financial Aid Office and the results will be used by the Rotary Club of Tucson as part of the scholarship selection criteria. Each applicant must complete and submit a Financial Needs Analysis waiver to Pima College giving Pima College permission to share their findings with the Rotary Club of Tucson.

Interview: Award of this scholarship **may be** contingent upon Rotary's face-to-face interview with the applicant. Following review of submitted applications, the Rotary club of Tucson Scholarship Committee **may** interview finalists, in which case the applicants will be notified as to time and place to meet. The purpose of the interview will be to better assess applicants' qualifications, clarify any questions the students may have, and to convey to the applicants something about the ideals of Rotary.
